Amy M. Coes SP '22, SC '24 is an independent arts consultant and American decorative arts scholar specializing in 18th-century American furniture. Her research appears in American Furniture and The Magazine Antiques; she contributed to An American Odyssey: The Warner Collection of American Fine and Decorative Arts and was editor of The Thomas Poynton Ives House, both published by Sotheby's. Amy received a BA from Hollins College and an MA in History of Decorative Arts from The Bard Graduate Center.



Genevieve Cortinovis '14 is the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation Associate Curator of Decorative Arts and Design at the Saint Louis Art Museum. Since joining the museum in 2012, she has curated numerous installations and exhibitions, including the recent blockbuster Roaring: Art, Fashion and the Automobile in France and Fabricating Empire: Folk Textiles and the Making of Modern Austrian Design. She holds an MA from the Bard Graduate Center and a BA in art history with honors from Barnard College.

Jack Kilgore '24, LHC '25, RCS '25 is a collector and dealer in European fine art, specializing in Old Master paintings, as well as 19th century, and early 20th century European works, sold by his eponymous gallery in New York. He was Associate Vice President for Christie's in Old Masters and Director of Richard L. Feigen & Co. He has a BA in English Literature from Stanford University, as well as a JD and an MA from the University of Virginia.



Susan J. Rawles '96, RCS '98, SP '19, '22, '24, '25, LHC '23 is the Elizabeth Locke Associate Curator of American Decorative Arts at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond, specializing in American history and material culture of the long 18th century. She holds a PhD in American Studies from William and Mary and an MA in the History of Art from Rice University, where she received the Jameson Fellowship for study at the MFA Houston's Bayou Bend Collection.
